# सेवानिवृत्त मुंबई पोलिसांची फरफट

३० टक्के सेवानिवृत्त पोलीस पेन्शनपासून वंचित

मुंबई : बढारी वृत्तसेवा

'शासकीय काम सहा महिने थांब' अशी म्हण आहे. यां म्हणीचा अनुभव मुंबई पोलीस दलातील सेवानिवृत्त पोलिसांना येत आहे. पण, ते सहा महिन्यापासून नव्हे तर दोन ते तीन वर्षांपासन पेन्शनसाठी झगडत आहेत. पेन्शनची प्रक्रिया वेळखाऊ असल्याने सुमारे ३० टके सेवानिवृत्त पोलीस आजही पेन्शनच्या लाभापासून वंचित आहेत. त्यामुळे पेन्शनसह इतर प्रश्नही प्रशासनाने लवकर सोडवावेत अशी मागणी त्यांच्याकडून होत आहे.

मुंबई पोलीस दलात वर्षाला साधारणतः हजारांवर पोलीस सेवानिवृत्त होतात. सेवानिवृत्तीनंतर पोलीस प्रशासन संबंधित अधिकारी व कर्मचाऱ्यांची सेवा पुस्तिका प्रथम आयकर विभागाकडे पाठवते. तेथे सेवापुस्तिकेची पडताळणी केली जाते. यात सेवेत असताना पोलीस अधिकारी व कर्मचाऱ्यांच्या त्रूटी, अर्जित रजा अशा सर्व बाबी तपासल्या जातात. त्यानंतर आयकर

सेवानिवृत्त पोलिसांच्या पेन्शनचा मार्ग निवृत्तीनंतर पहिल्या सहा महिन्यातच सुटला पाहिजे. पण, तसे होत नाही. सातत्याने यासाठी प्रशासनाबरोबर पाठपुरावा सुरु आहे. मनुष्यबळ कमी असल्याचे कारण प्रशासन आम्हाला सांगते. सेवानिवृत्त पोलिसांच्या प्रश्नांवर मुख्यमंत्री एकनाथ शिंदे व उपमुख्यमंत्री देवेंद्र फडणवीस यांनी बैठक घेण्याचे आश्वासन दिले होते. मात्र, अद्यापही ही बैठक झालेली नाही.

- that said news the in stated 3. It is Police Department takes its own time i.e. two to three years to start pension to the retired Police Officers. It is to be noted that retirement benefits is the right of the public servant including Atleast they must get immediately Police Department. retirement benefits after the date of retirement. There is a statement of Mr. Mohan Todkar, President, Mumbai Retired Police Officers (मुंबई सेवानिवृत्त पोलीस) that Government takes two to three years to start the pension and because of that retired Police Officers required to suffer.
- Considering these facts the following order is passed:
  - a) Office is directed to issue summons to the Addl. Chief Secretary (Home Department), Mantralaya, Mumbai,

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calling upon them to file his affidavit in reply to the news appeared in Marathi News Paper Pudhari dated 21.11.2022 and also explain why department is taking two to three years to start the pension of retired police officers. He has to explain in his affidavit at present how many Police Officers are waiting for their pension and reason for the delay.

- b) Affidavit in reply to be filed before this Commission on or before 12.12.2022.
- c) Matter to appear on board before Division Bench of Justice K. K. Tated, Chairperson and Shri. Bhagwantrao D. More, Member in Court No.1 on 12<sup>th</sup> December 2022 at 11.00 a.m.

#### ORDER

(Per Hon'ble Member M. A. Sayeed)

The present Suo Motu petition came to be initiated on the basis of news reporting in Marathi Local Newspaper "Pudhari" dated 21.11.2022 about depriving the retired police officials from getting their pension, resulting into hard shift to them.

- Pursuant to the direction dated 12.12.2022, report as affidavit in 2 reply Ex. "A" came to be submitted by Adv. Mr. Shaikh representing the respondent department. The relevant para read thus,
- "3. I say that from 1st January 2020 to 31st August 2022 a total of 3905 Police Officers inclusive of all ranks retired form service. I say from the aforesaid number of retired officers, the Pay Verification Process of the 843 officers is under way and they are being given provisional pension. The rest of 3062 officer are getting regular pension. I say that the pension process starts after pay verification is completed. I say that it is the endeavour of the establishment to complete the said pay verification process at the earliest. I say that the State again issued Government Resolution dated 7<sup>th</sup> May 2021 to further fast track the grant of provisional pension from a period of 6 months to 12 months. Is hereto

annexed and marked as EXHIBIT-R2. I say that this helped ease the burden and provide financial relief to retired officers.

- 4. I say that prior to giving pension the procedure under Rule 121 of MCS (Pension) Rules is followed. I say that Provisional Pension is granted as per Rule 126 of the MCS (Pension) Rules. I say that provisional pension is started soon after an application is made by the retired employee. I say that provisional pension is granted as the procedure for initiation of pension payments may get delayed for procedural reasons."
- 3. From reading of the above paragraphs, it is clear that steps for released of provisional as well as regular pension has been taken by the parole department and therefore, it can be safely concluded that issue has been resolved. Accordingly Suo Motu case stands closed and disposed off.
